
lots of people started showing up, and the party really got underway!

DCL comes to FAST

Thanks to "Vampz", the FAST Network is now running the "DCL" (Dual Channel Link) software. Vampz is the programmer who wrote the /I mods, and these mods include the Dual Channel Link.

For FAST, this Dual Channel Link has been a real advantage. We run channels 1 and 2 as our two "shared" channels, here at FAST. (The DCL can be run so that either /T1 and /T2 are "shared" channels, or /T3 and /T4). Naturally, it makes a lot more sense to unite the two public channels, and that is just what we've done.

Helping new users has become a much easier job for us, with the DCL. ONE good co-sysop can get out there and work with all the new people on all the network stations. This gives our cosysops real good control in terms of those who would continue to call one station after another always hoping to find a "new face". With the DCL, a cosysop need only to sit on his or her local /T1 - and the co-sysop will have a good view of the entire network.

Aside from the help it gives us in terms of regulating and helping new callers, the DCL is also fun for our users. I've logged in to see one group talking cars on one channel and another group talking music on the other shared channel. FAST - which can support as many as 24 people online at one timecan take good advantage of this innovation that Vampz has made possible for us.

Diversi-Dial™ hits the news

Diversi-Dial™ is becoming more and more popular amongst the moderning world. This fascinating program caught so much attention lately that it has been reviewed in the May 1987 issue of A+ magazine (a magazine for apple users). A+ has a national circulation of over 175,000 copies.

Locally, the FAST Network has been churning up some attention, so it seems, from nearby newspapers. Lakeland Today (approx. circulation 35,000), Wayne Today (approx. circulation 15,000) and Dateline Journal (approx. circulation 40,000) ran articles on Sunday, June 7 reviewing the FAST Network and explaining what it is all about. These newspapers listed all of the FAST Network telephone numbers and is a sure way to get some local attention.

Diversi-Dial, which has at one time been for the few modern users who "by chance" caught word of it, is now becoming more widely known. The publicity has made the word Diversi-Dial known to many more who might otherwise have never heard of it.

Diversi-Dial is the latest in growing computer network

WAYNE-Most people think of computers as complex machines geared to the minds of the technically oriented. Micro computers, such as Apple, Atari and Commodore, caused quite a sensation about a year or two ago in many homes across America. However, many of these abandoned toys now sit collecting dust in the attics of the people who bought them, only to find the touted micro was of very little use to them in their everyday lives.

What most Americans don't know, however, is that with the addition of a "Modem," (a device that makes it possible for you to hook your own computer up to another person's home computer using your telephone as the "go between,") you can instantly connect your computer into a growing social network.

network. Diversi-Dial. can be joined with little technical expertise. New Jersey is a particular hotspot for Diversi-

As of this writing there are six "D-Dial" stations in the Garden State. The local stations, include Frankly Speaking (633-0569), Flash-Talk (743-4850) and Attic Static (654-1680).

All you need is a home computer, a modem and your home telephone. Any local computer store can help you get "on line;" and the cost of the equipment necessary to get there is min-

Your modem will come with instructions, so, before long, you should be experiencing the thrill of hearing your first "carrier signal" -the sound that aids you in knowing when your machine is hooking itself up to another computer.

Once you have reached another modem, there are a few systems that might be at the other end. "Bulletin Board System," is the first possibility, which are home computers owned by individuals. When reached via your own modem and computer, this system is able to read public messages stated by others.

After you have registered at the "BBS," you'll be able to leave electronic mail to others on the system, and read your own mail when you call back in.

That's fun, but there are those who have gone to the further excitement of Diversi-Dial, where you will find yourself online with seven or more people at once. Once you become used to the simple commands needed to be part of it all, you'll realize some of the people typing may live right around the corner from you. Moreover, if you don't know the people on your local "D-Dial" station you'll be presented with the opportunity to meet the whole "family" right away, since there are D-Dial events every week, such as bowling, roller skating, picnics and many more.



Basham comments on Mods

The following article was a message to all Sysops from Bill Basham (author of Diversi-Dial™) issued on April 24, 1987.

FAST Times has received Basham's permission to reprint this article.

Modification Policy

I allow you to modify your Diversi-Dial as long as you realize that I cannot answer questions about problems with a modified station. Furthermore, any modifications you make must not be offensive to users, or other station owners, because of the link network.

In particular, it must not be possible for anyone to see messages which users think are private. That is, your modifications must not allow anyone to read /P messages, or conversations on "Private" channels. I will not support or provide updates to any station which reads private messages. If you do this, I guarantee you will lose all your users anyway, so you won't need updates!

Initially, the "Vampz" modifications did allow the reading of private messages, which caused a lot of trouble. I have now been assured that these modifications have been revised. and do not allow reading /P's. I ask all sysops to believe this, and to stop suggesting that these stations can read /P's.

If you are considering getting the Vampz mods, remember that they won't work with Diversi-Dial updates at first. Every time I do an update, he will have to do an update. As long as you know what you're getting, I have no objection to anyone using these modifications at present.

Finally, I hope you will strongly discourage your users from harassing other system operators. This will only lead to counter-harassment of your station, and you will lose your users. It is good business to get along with your fellow sysops, and it will make Diversi-Dial a lot more fun for all.

So let's all work togther to make the Diversi-Dial network a better place to call. Thanks for your help.

Guest Passwords Issued on FAST

Starting about a month ago, the FAST Network began making guest passwords available to those who qualify for them.

In order to be eligible for a free guest password you need to be new to Diversi-Dial. We feel that for a bonafide new user a guest password is a very nice way to get to know what D-Dial is all about. Having a guest password gives a new user the opportunity to be a part of the "family" right from the beginning.

Instead of spending his or her time online "begging for /V's" - the new user can get right in there and get the feel of what D-Dial is really like.

Guest passwords are issued for two week periods, and differ from full passwords in a few ways.

- •With a guest password you need to enter your handle each time you call in.
- •Guest password holders time out in 10 minutes if the system is full, rather than the 40 minutes of online time per call a regular password holder gets.
- •Guest passwords permit the bearer to receive email, but not to send it. (Regular passwords of course permit receiving or sending of email.)

Even with the above restrictions, the guest password still gives the new user a feel of what D-Dial is really like.

So far the guest passwords have been very well received, and many of our "guest password" holders have already became regular password holders since this new plan took effect.

FAST intends to continue issuing these free 2 week accounts, so if you know of anyone who hasn't called D-Dial, and think they might be interested in seeing what we're all about, invite them to the network to visit. If I'm around, or if one of the station owners, or Kip or Ice Maniac are online, just let us know you've got someone new on-line, and we'll take their information and get them a free two week trial password.
